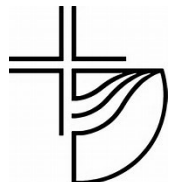

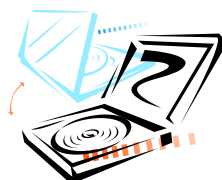

## French Lick - West Baden

In Southwest Indiana we in Indiana have two of the grandest hotels. They were both built at the turn of the century. The history that follows the buildings is incredible.

The area began with the attraction being the Pluto water from a spring which was marketed as a health tonic (laxative).

The hotels followed along with the gambling and it became a tourist attraction with train tracks straight from Chicago and elsewhere. It was luxurious and the clients were no doubt wealthy.

The French Lick Hotel has a wrap around porch that you could sit and enjoy if you did nothing else, the detail and scale of the inside is unimaginable.

The West Baden Hotel is a structural wonder with its massive dome, and the rooms around the atrium which is round like the dome. It is still an engineering genius how it was built and built in the time span of a year. Ed Ballard was the owner for a time <sup>period</sup> until the Depression. Father to Charles Ballard of our Peru area.

By 2006 both buildings were needing some high finance repair. In 2015 the Cooks (Bill & Gloria) founders of the



Cook Medical Group, based in Bloomington.

The money they spent, 50,000,000 plus to refurbish and bring these buildings back to the grand scale as they were the turn of the century, we all can never thank them enough.

I did not ~~not~~ include any technical history but paper back books are available at French Lick, which are great reading even if you don't like history. Also, there are a couple books out by Bill Cook, now deceased but his wife and son carry on the business.

We would like to offer a sincere “thank you” to the community for the care and generosity shown to needy this past year. We are grateful for the difference that has been made (due to your help) in the lives of those who come to The Salvation Army for assistance.

Since January 2017, due to the various food drives and food donations, we have been able to help 632 households with groceries. Through the emergency assistance program that is supported by donors we have been able to assist 112 families to either keep their utilities from being disconnected or evicted from their homes. During this past Christmas season (2016) 295 families were helped with food and 449 children received Christmas gifts through the toy shop or angel tree program. Contributions totaled \$27,414.44 through the red kettles with 84 volunteers logging 445.5 hours.

Although, we didn’t reach our goal during the red kettle campaign, we did amazingly well considering we were in the midst of reorganizing The Salvation Army in Miami County. We would like to take this opportunity to inform members of the community that The Salvation Army is still located in Miami County (same location, east door) and will continue offering Emergency Assistance, Food Pantry and Christmas Assistance.

The help that the Salvation Army provides at Christmas and throughout the year is a direct reflection on the generosity of the residents of Miami County. **THANK YOU!!** for demonstrating the love of God through your gift of volunteerism and donations.

We rely on volunteers for our red kettle campaign which generates the funding to provide assistance for the needy in our community. This year we have a Kettle Coordinator, Susie Shively, who will be contacting individuals for scheduling. We hope you or your organization will be able to partner with us during this Bell Ringing Season.

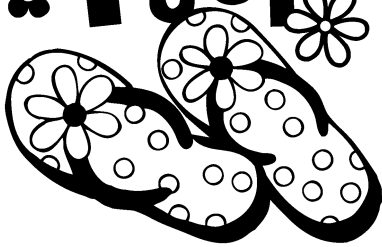

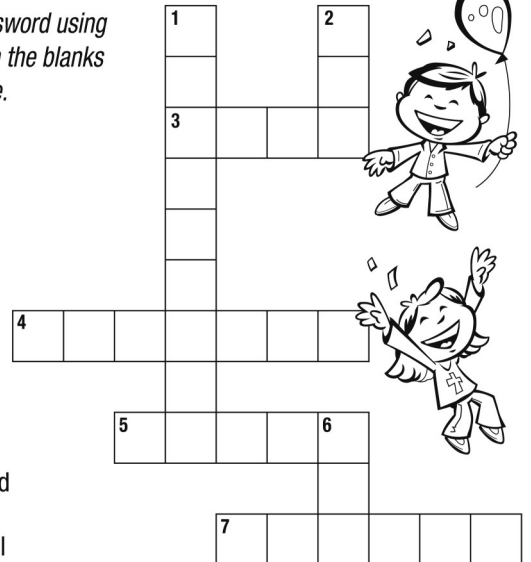
