Making Hay While the Sun Shines

When it gets hot like it has through the middle of June, all I can think of is the hours spent in the hot sun baling hay.

One of the most unforgettable neighbors was Howard (Shorty) Conner who lived behind us. Lots of times they used their own tractor on our baler.

For Shorty, if the cigarette lighter on the tractor did not work, that would definitely get fixed. Chesterfield's Non-Filter was his cigarette of choice. If you were on the wagon behind the baler, you were on your own as Shorty might look back a couple of times a round. Broken bales were rare but when you switched bales of twine you might have a broken bale. With Shorty, you might have 6 or 8 bales on the ground till he saw he needed to stop... always with that grin as if to say, "should have done better" and sucked through his teeth...never forgot that trait. Now when your wagon was getting full, you had to plan your escape, throw the last bale up, jump down, and pull the hitch pin before the next bale pinned you against the load of hay. You might have another 6 or 8 bales on the ground before he stopped again.

We baled hay for Russell Harter which is Barbara Warner's dad. He was great to be around, so easy going, the bibbed overalls...

He had an Allis Chalmers D17, if you know tractors; it had a hand clutch on the right side. Russell would cross his legs on the right side, just like he was in his easy chair in the evening, and we were ready to go. He always smoked a pipe; he had a groove in his teeth that allowed it to fit perfectly. He could load that pipe and fire it up with one hand and do a good job of staying on the windrow. The only other person I knew that had worn their teeth to fit a pipe perfectly was Vic Fouts, he hauled cattle for us and lived the next mile east.

Russell never had an ounce of fat on him; I think he was called "Slim". Sometimes you wish those extra pounds were gone today, but life styles back then sure tended to keep people thin.

I remember after we baled all day at Jack Gunnels' farm, where Cy lives, Jack just wanted to see how things were going. We were all standing around visiting and Shorty gets Jack's billfold out of his pocket, (it's one of those zippered with the chain style), and proceeds to pay all of us. All the time Jack is trying to get his billfold back. Jack gets it back, and it had big bucks inside.


You can't get those days back, but some I don't want back....

KIDZ ZONE




Summer is the perfect time to gaze at the wonders in the sky. Make this craft as a reminder of God's handiwork — including you!

What you need:

- Glass jar
- Permanent marker
- Glue (and water)
- Paper plate
- Paintbrush
- Star sequins
- Battery-operated tea light
