History of Veterans Day

World War I, known at the time as "The Great War", officially ended when the Treaty of Versailles was signed on June 28, 1919. However, fighting ceased seven months earlier when an armistice or temporary cessation of hostilities, between the Allied nations and Germany went into effect on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month. For that reason, November 11, 1918, is generally regarded as the end of "the war to end all wars".

Veterans Day continues to be observed on November 11 regardless of what day of the week on which it falls.

At first, it was called Armistice Day but as World War II and the Korean Conflict finished up they decided to call it Veterans Day to honor all veterans.

So as November rolls around this year, November 11 will be a milestone as it was 100 years ago that World War I finished up.

Lately it seems, corporate businesses, like Lowes for example, give you a 10% discount if you are a Veteran, and restaurants have free lunches for Veterans on Veterans Day. I love Lowes when you check out and they see you are a Veteran, it's on file, they always say, "Thank you for your service!" I don't know of any place that does that as a general rule.

So, in short, Veterans Day is a celebration to honor America's Veterans for their patriotism, love of their country, and willingness to serve and sacrifice for the common good. - Historian, Glenn Conner

Enjoy searching for seasonal aspects of God's creation!




What you need:
